



Addendum to Oasis Academy Byron Behaviour for Learning Policy- September 2020

Good student behaviour and positive attitudes to learning are crucial. This addendum lists temporary changes to the main Oasis Academy Byron Behaviour for Learning Policy surrounding following return from Covid-19 to ensure children to ensuring that students settle back into school successfully and catch up rapidly.

Level 1: Vision and Values	Additional re-booting plans given the time away from schools to reiterate and explore vision and values in consideration of changes to life under lockdown. Children and staff will be reminded of the academy vision and Oasis 9 Habits at the beginning of term
Level 2: PD Curriculum	Strategies to support mental health of the most vulnerable pupils will be used. Two staff have received Mental Health First Aid training and there is a trained ELSA on the staff A Recovery Curriculum will be in place for the first weeks in the Autumn Term based on the research carried out by Barry Carpenter and advocated in the DfE information Adaptations to PHSCE/RHSE curriculum to cover lost learning opportunities.
Level 3: Systems and structure	Proactive structures specific to covid-19 return to support most vulnerable. Changes to rewards policy in light of hygiene expectations Deliberate unhygienic behaviour/physical contact response Changes to celebrations/escalations given
Level 4: Staff development	Training for staff specific to Covid-19 response Grief and Loss training plans implemented from staff training from OCL training. Mentally Healthy School training plan for the academy from OCL training. An INSET Day in September will provide the whole staff with Mindfulness Training.

Expectations of Parents/Carers

- Only one parent/carer to bring child (ren) to school
- Pre-school children to stay with Parent/Carer at all times (e.g. buggy, holding hands, reigns)
- Ensure you maintain social distance from other adults whilst waiting for the gate to open – as per government guidance (please do not arrive too early to avoid congregation)
- Parents/Carers not to enter the school premises– please telephone or email the office
- Collect your child as soon as possible of called regarding illness/symptoms
- Stick to allocated drop off/pick up times
- Parents/Carers to collect their child if they are not adhering to the NO TOUCHING rules (reminders given prior to this request for collection)
- Packed lunches are to be brought to school in a disposable bag
- Inform the office via telephone or email if your child is unwell and seek medical advice (NHS 111). Update the office with the guidance you have been given to follow.

Expectations of children

- Children to line up at a social distance in school when asked
- Children to enter the building separately and patiently
- Children to wash hands/sanitise when entering the building and at

regular intervals throughout the day

- Avoid touching their mouth, nose and eyes and follow the ‘catch it, bin it. Kill it’ advice
- Children should stay at a social distance as much as possible (adults in school to remind children when necessary)
- Children should not play games that include touching others (e.g. tag, stuck in the mud, etc)
- Children not sticking to the NO TOUCHING rules will be reminded and parents informed to support with reinforcement
- Children to follow any signs and special routes in place (e.g. one way system)
- Only use their own water bottle and resources □
- Children to follow all instructions for any adult
- Children to treat all others with care and respect
- Children to help keep the environment clean and safe, and treat all equipment with care
- Children to use language which is caring and suitable, being polite at all times
- Children to complete all tasks set to the best of their ability








If your child does not follow our code of conduct

- Your child will receive a verbal warning
- If the behaviour continues, your child will receive a short sanction followed by a discussion with an adult about their choices
- A member of the Senior Leadership Team will arrange a telephone or socially distanced meeting with you to discuss the behaviours causing concern.
- You will be asked to collect your child immediately or they will not be able to return
- If there is no improvement in their behaviour, they will no longer be offered a place



- Receive a verbal warning of “That behaviour does not meet the rules of keeping everybody safe” and you will complete a restorative self-reflection with an adult about your behaviour including how that behaviour endangers others.
- If behaviour then continues, you will receive a short sanction and discussion with a senior leader about your choices and a phone call will be made to your parent.
- If a decision is made that you are unsafe on that day, your parents must collect you immediately or you will not be able to return.
- When you return, if there is no improvement you will be asked to stay away from Oasis Byron during this period.
