As you all know, the present plan is for schools to begin to reopen with effect from the 1st June to Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 classes in addition to the current provision available for the children of keyworkers.

We are very much looking forward to seeing pupils again and helping Year 6 get ready for their important transition to high school.




We have already contacted parents and carers of children in these year groups. Those parents and carers who confirmed that they want their children to return at this time will receive specific confirmation of attendance and class arrangements on the 29th May 2020, when we all know the Government's final decision.

As children begin to return, it is vitally important that everyone is aware that the site and activities will be very different. This includes strict restrictions on contact, teaching in small 'bubble' groups of up to 7 children on allocated days, strict rules on hygiene (we will be checking the temperatures of all staff and children on arrival at school) and social distancing with no intermingling of the 'bubble' groups in school.



We will also ask that only one parent/carer brings and collects their child/children at the allocated start and end times. Signs and social distance markings (see examples) will be clearly visible around the school grounds.


Learning packs will of course continue to be produced every week.
